More complex cases involve more work and time than a standard estate which makes it difficult to estimate the likely costs involved without having full information about the estate.

Examples of complex estates include cases where:

- inheritance tax is payable
- lifetime inheritance tax-planning by the deceased is reportable by the executors to H M Revenue & Customs
- the deceased owned foreign property
- the deceased had an interest in a trust at the date of death
